As this is the first newsletter for the year, I would like to welcome new families and welcome back returning families, to what will be a very exciting year at Heatherwood School.

Thank you to the many families who have taken the opportunity to be part of their child's education by attending the SSG's. I hope you found the meetings worthwhile, and you gained an insight into the educational programs being offered to your child and plans for their growth. Individual Education Plans

(IEPs - long and short term goals) are essential to plan and track students growth.

SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (SWPBS) Sharon Koupparis



Heatherwood School is a School Wide Positive Behaviours (SWPBS) School. School-wide positive behaviour support (SWPBS) is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe and supportive learning cultures. Our positive behaviours centre around the three main values of Be Respectful, Be Your Best and Be Safe. We will be looking at all three values in term one, followed by a focus on one value each term for the remainder of the year.

SWPBS helps schools improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people. When SWPBS is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- increased respectful and positive behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices
- a predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance.

We are in the early stages of implementing SWPBS at Heatherwood School. All classes in years 7 - 12 have a dedicated period each week that includes explicit teaching on a focus area. Our ticket system is up and running and our next steps are to implement an incentive program. We look forward to seeing the many positive changes to learning and engagement across our school community and welcome any feedback you may have.


I will be aiming to swim 400 laps of the 50 metre pool during March - adding up to 20km.




